### Written Report

The written report must be handwritten on lined paper. It must include the following:

1. Title
2. Author/Illustrator
3. Main characters
4. Plot
5. Did you like it?
6. Would you recommend it to others?

Please make sure it has a cover with the title of the book and your child's name. The cover should also include an illustration of the best part of the story.

### Project

The project can be a poster or diorama of their favorite part of the book. On an index card your child should write the author, illustrator, and a short description of their project. They should be able to explain the plot of the story and whether or not they liked it and if they would recommend the book to others.
